
YSGOL MIN Y DDOL NEWS

about the events and consequences of the Disaster. It was a moving service where they had artefacts on show that were used by the miners.



On 20th September we lost a stalwart of the Cefn Community, Ken Bathers sadly passed away. Ken was well known throughout the area due to his many volunteering activities he carried out some of which were: Chair of Cefn Community Council, he is the longest serving member of the Council having been a member for over 30 years and Chair for the last 11 years; he was a School Governor at both Ysgol Rhiwabon and Rhosymedre the latter of which he was Chair. He was President of The Llangollen Maelor Fishing Club and had been since the both clubs merged. Ken was very forward thinking he did everything he could for the people of Cefn area he represented, such as his part in bringing Tesco to the village, the Solar Farm at the Delph and the Telecom mast on the GEH all of which has brought significant annual income into our community. Ken enjoyed many different interests and pastimes which I would find hard to rank in order of preference as to me Ken appeared to love them all equally: Fishing: Particularly salmon fishing, fishing many rivers in the UK, also travelling to Alaska on five occasions to experience catching really big salmon there. The highlight of Ken's angling year was his part in organising and staging the European Team Grayling Championships held along large stretches of the River Dee from Corwen to Cefn, attracting teams from all over the Continent. Football at all levels from youth to the Premiership, though the rest of his family supported Manchester United, Ken like me was a Liverpool fan. with his camera. Ken had been very excited and enthusiastic with the WW1 commemorative project that Cefn Community Council are running, three of our local primary schools have engaged in the research of the soldiers from our Community who died in that terrible war. Amongst other activities on this project, Ken has been in charge of the tribute the schools have completed making poppies which will be displayed at the George Edwards Hall later this year. On a personal note my wife and I will miss Ken very much as we have been family friends for many years, our deepest sympathy and condolences goes out to Jean and the family. I am saddened to have to report the death on the 20th September 2018 aged 74 of Ken Bathers, President of Llangollen Maelor Angling Club. Ken. was born and bred in Cefn Mawr, Wrexham. He was educated locally and commenced employment at the local brickworks before joining the chemical company Monsanto as a plant operator. He lived in Cefn Mawr until his passing and was a great champion for the village. Fishing the river Dee was Ken's great passion although he also made trips to Alaska. He enjoyed being a ghillie for Lady Malabar and her guests on the Llandyn beat of the Dee during the 70's and early 8o's. Due to ill health his fishing had been restricted over the last 10 years. He remained however enthusiastic about the Dee. He was a great telephone man free with advice to all on river heights and the best beats to try. He was an accomplished fly tier and gave away thousands of flies over the years. I can hear him now saying "Give this one a go Bud you'll definitely catch on that". He kept the catch returns for the club and was genuinely excited when an angler rang to inform him of a salmon caught. He was soon on the phone letting the whole Dee valley know the details. One of Ken's proudest achievements was rearing brown trout for over 30 years in the outflow of the Monsanto chemical works. All the trout raised being

stocked into the Dee. He served on the committees of the Local Fisheries Advisory Group, Welsh Salmon and Trout Association, Dee Fisheries Association and Upper Dee Angling Federation. He was also an honorary water bailiff for the National Rivers Authority. Some 18 years ago he established the International Grayling competition on the Dee. This has gone from strength to strength and this December will see 36 teams compete for the Hanak Trophy. Competitors come from all over the UK, Ireland and continental Europe. Over these years Ken raised over £60,000 for the Welsh Dee Trust to carry out river habitat Improvements Away from fishing Ken was a local campaigner, a governor for 2 local schools and for the last 11 years had chaired the Cefn Mawr Community Council. He also loved football and would watch all the televised games as well as watching his Grandsons play. We express our deepest sympathy to the family. Unfortunately, despite attending all the latest "Master Planning" meetings organised by Arcadis for WCBC, CRT & Eastman's and making the best case we can for our community and the importance of WBG to our economic recovery this has been ignored. Furthermore, they have also seen fit to alter our Google Maps page which now shows the WBG as a coach parking area. Their idea being, this is some where for the EMPTY coaches to park once they have dropped off the tourists at the new parking lot, opened on the old warehouse site immediately adjacent to the Trevor Basin, as we reported on earlier this year. Furthermore, they have also changed the website link form ours, which promotes our community, to theirs which does not.

This is a direct slap in the face for our community with one of the highest unemployment ratings in North East Wales since the closure of Monsanto and Air Products and is not in accordance with Welsh Planning Policy by WAG.
