#### **ROTARY IN DISASTER!** Mike Lade from the *Vale of Llangollen Rotary* visited the I<sup>st</sup>





**Q&A** With GHP Legal's Andy Howarth

Are aftercare services available following temporary detention under the Mental Health Act?

Q: My son developed mental health problems and epilepsy after his father's death. He then started taking recreational drugs because he heard they might help. They didn't. He became irrational, stole money for drugs, and regularly forgot his epilepsy medication. I got him into residential rehab, and all went well until he wanted to return home. Since then, his mental health has deteriorated further. If he was formally detained under the Mental Health Act, would he have a right to aftercare services, as I feel this would make a big difference.

A: Your son can receive community care services whether he's been detained or not. Under the Care Act he's entitled to receive services to meet his eligible needs, as assessed by the local and health authorities.

Additionally, anyone who has been detained under a treatment section of the Mental Health Act (usually s3 or 37) has a statutory right under s117 of the Act to receive community care services to meet any need arising out of a mental disorder. One crucial difference between services provided under the Care Act and services provided under s117 is that the latter are not means tested and cannot be charged for.

However, if you are detained under section 2 of the MHA, this doesn't entitle you to services under s.117. Services that can be provided under s.117 include regular visits from social workers, support workers and community psychiatric nurses; supported accommodation; psychological therapies and employment support.

Your son's local social services authority, together with the Integrated Care System (ICS) in England or the Local Health Board in Wales, are responsible for providing s.117 aftercare services. Disputes about which of them is going to provide and pay for the aftercare are not uncommon and seeking advice from a mental health lawyer can help prevent such disputes from delaying discharge.

Aftercare services under s117 will continue to be provided until such time as the responsible authorities are satisfied they are no longer required.

#### LLANGOLLEN MUSEUM NEWS

Having closed over the Christmas period Llangollen Museum the closure was extended throughout January for planned collection assessment and cleaning. However, the New Year has seen unexpected setbacks. We have reported before that the roof of the Museum has to be replaced, and that we are in the middle of putting together applications to raise the necessary funds. As part of this programme, we plan to purchase the Museum building from the County Council to ensure that the Museum is available to the community and visitors long into the future.

Unfortunately, over the Christmas period, the roof leak has got worse and we have had to move some items out of one of the archive stores. As well as that, just over a week ago, one of the internal downpipes that drain water from the roof became blocked. This caused the pipe to fill up and leak from joints upstairs

and downstairs, soaking the carpets and walls. The pipe has been unblocked but now we have the mammoth task of drying out the Museum. We have brought in commercial dehumidifiers to take the moisture out of the air and we are temporarily relocating parts of the collection off site while the Museum dries out – many thanks to all of the volunteers from different groups who are helping with that. What this meant was that there was a possibility we would not be able to open as intended however we have managed to sort everything out and we are now open **Saturday to Thursday** from **11am to 4pm** and closed on **Fridays**.

Now we have re-open we will be looking ahead to all of the things that we have planned for 2023. Included the roof replacement project and the purchase of the Museum, there will be a number of planned activities to help community members and groups discover more about the heritage of our unique area. In addition, we will be resuming our programme of talks, including ones on Dylan Thomas and the 1950s Eisteddfod, the Offa's Dyke path and boundaries between England and Wales, the hidden history and folklore of churches

#### **PCSOs UPDATE**

Local Environmental Awareness on Dogs LEAD a police-led, initiative to encourage responsible dog ownership of all breeds of dog, seeks to provide advice to the public on dog issues, improve dog safety and dog welfare. It also deals with anti-social and inconsiderate behaviour by individuals with



dogs in a way that protects and reassures the public. Aimed at all dog owners in North Wales, whether in private or rented accommodation. It is being promoted through regular dog roadshows, engagement with owners during regular patrols and through day-to-day contact with owners of dogs that come to police attention. To achieve this we are working closely with our partner agencies, which include Anglesey, Conwy, Denbighshire, Flintshire & Wrexham Councils, Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board and the RSPCA. Annual surveys of residents highlight those issues concerning dogs, such as nuisance and dog fouling, are high on the list of concerns amongst residents in the area - and **LEAD** is aimed at tackling these concerns. In our day-to-day police work, we are:

• recording all incidents involving negative dog behaviour including dog attacks on people and animals; dog welfare and dog fouling. This is important to create a documented history should enforcement be necessary.

• encouraging owners (if a social housing resident) to register their dog with their landlord.

• arranging dog roadshows that offer dog advice and free or discounted dog micro-chipping, now a legal requirement. As well as encouraging responsible dog ownership and giving advice, there are times when it is necessary for police to intervene, initiate control measures and ultimately prosecute offenders. We will intervene when:

dogs are used by owners to commit crime

dogs are linked with anti-social behaviour

prohibited types / breeds come to notice.

We will act to enforce the law and protect the public when ever necessary and where legislation permits. Measures include:1st 'Come to Notice' letter. Letters will be sent with supporting literature. 2nd 'Come to Notice' letter. Should the dog's behaviour come to notice again, a 2nd letter will be hand delivered by the local Neighbourhood Police Team. If the dog owner is a social housing resident, the landlord will contact the dog owner within seven working days to remind them of, or enforce, their tenancy agreement. Continued anti-social behaviour, could result in permission to have a dog being withdrawn or even the property being repossessed. Acceptable Behaviour Contract (ABC) As the second letter is sent, an ABC, a voluntary agreement between police and the individual will be sought. If declined, the Neighbourhood Police Team will monitor the dog's behaviour for at least six months. Community Protection Notice (CPN), Contingent **Destruction Order on conviction under the Dangerous** Dogs Act or Control Order, Dogs Act 1871. Continued anti-social behaviour could result in a CPN, Contingent Destruction Order on conviction under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 or an appropriate Dog Control Order under the Dogs Act 1871. Please note that these measures can be sought at any time during the process Useful helplines:

Making new friends and performed fantastically as a



team, we were so proud when they finished in 3rd place and were awarded a medal each.

Froncysyllte CP School entered a team in the National Finals of the F1 in Schools Competition at the NEC Birmingham. The team, Blazing Star were brilliant through all parts of the project finishing 6th out of 26 teams from all over the UK who took part in the event so this was a massive achievement for our small school. All Key Stage Two pupils entered the project initially which involved them designing and making their own Formula One car being powered down a track using a gas canister. There are lots of different parts to the project and the groups had to create a portfolio of evidence as well as give a verbal presentation about their cars and create a unique team identity. All at Froncysyllte would like to thank AN Richards for their very kind sponsorship which meant all the teams could create their own uniform including a team badge created using their ICT skills. This half term, all Year 2 and above at Garth CP School have been working on an exciting project as part of the Lead Creative Schools initiative. Working with an artist and storyteller to develop their artistic and storytelling skills whilst exploring unique aspects of local history. Part of the project has involved the pupils having the exciting opportunity to speak with a gentleman who has Welsh Nigerian roots. This was a fascinating experience for the pupils as it gave them the chance to find out more about the similarities and differences between Welsh and Nigerian Culture. Over the coming weeks, they will be working in mixed aged groups to show what they have learnt in a variety of different ways including storyboarding, drama and ICT.

Before Christmas, pupils from Pentre Church in Wales took part in a netball festival hosted by Ysgol Dinas Bran. Staff and pupils were thrilled when the Pentre team won the tournament for the second year in a row. Being undefeated in all of their games, the pupils involved were excellent representatives of the school. The pupils were awarded a medal each for their achievements. In another sporting success story, one of Pentre's Year 6 pupils won the *County Cross Country Festival*. The school was very proud of the fact that this event was attended by all pupils in the Years 5 and 6 class, giving them all the opportunity to have a go at the event.




